James Peters' White Buffalo Scholarship Award Process

1. A scout will be eligible to receive an award prior to attending NYLT – White Buffalo.
2. A scout will be eligible to receive additional reimbursement for the year following attendance at NYLT – White Buffalo, by fulfilling the Youth Leader Attendance Policy.
3. A scout will only be eligible for reimbursement by fulfilling the Youth Leader Attendance Policy whether he holds a designated youth leadership position or not.
4. A scout will be evaluated and may be eligible for reimbursement
 - a. With scoutmaster recommendation and committee approval – or –
 - b. after 6 months of service, generally in February, and monthly thereafter.
5. The Troop Committee may adjust the award, reimbursement, and timeline on an individual basis should a situation arise.

Youth Leadership Attendance Policy

APPLICABLE TO:

- Senior Patrol Leader (SPL)
- Assistant Senior Patrol Leader (ASPL)
- Patrol Leader (PL)
- Assistant Patrol Leader (APL)

POLICY:

1. Youth Leaders should attend 50% camping trips for a 6 month period
2. Youth Leaders should attend 75% weekly troop meetings for a 6 month period
3. For a scout to be eligible to be elected or appointed to Youth Leadership positions they must meet all attendance requirements
4. For a scout to maintain an elected or appointed Youth Leadership position they must meet all attendance requirements

James Peter's White Buffalo Scholarship

Standards for Troop 286

REQUIREMENTS

Age 14 by December 31 or older, and have finished grade 8

Rank of First Class or higher

Dues must be paid in full before the end of February

Have had no disciplinary issues during any part of the scouting year

GUIDELINES

Priority will be given to Scouts that meet more of these standards.

Participate in 2/3rds of regular scout meetings and more than half of monthly camp outs and outdoor activities.

Has held or currently holding position of patrol leader or Troop leadership position

Has intention of continuing with our troop over the next few years so the troop can benefit from its investment into the scout

Notify Scoutmaster no later than the end of February (this gives the committee enough time to meet with candidates and make decisions in a timely manner)

Interview with the committee (preferably during a committee meeting to have enough members there who may have questions) by the end of April

Acts responsibly and shows basic leadership skills during weekly meetings, camp outs and out meetings

If Scout is not given Campership, the Committee will advise Scout why it was not received and how the scout can earn it for next year
